

Introducing the BatchLine 5.4 Dashboard



How do I access the new Dashboard?

Once version 5.4 is installed on your machine, you will see a new button labelled 'Dashboard' on the left-hand side of BatchLine in the front office menu. Just click this button:



What does the new Dashboard do?

The Dashboard is designed to:

- Help you visualise sales and profits over time and compare time periods against each other.
- Allow you to see how categories and titles are performing.
- Help manage and stay on top of customer orders.
- Suggest possible titles to order if they are missing from stock or running out.
- Suggest possible returns for titles that are not selling.
- Allow you to export detailed data on sales and titles.

How can I learn how to use the Dashboard?

A lot of the Dashboard is very interactive so we encourage you to click on things (both right and left click) and play about with the menus that pop up. You shouldn't be able to break anything! What are some example tasks that the Dashboard can help me with?

- Try left clicking on different bits of the customer order graph to see what orders should be chased up. If you have clicked any of the bars in the 'Awaiting Collection' part of the graph you can click the 'Cust Collect' button to tell BatchLine that the order has been collected.
- Click on the 'Consider Return' detail button to get a list of titles per supplier that you can compile returns for highlight titles with the enter key and then click 'compile return'.
- Click on the 'Consider Order' detail button and go down the list highlighting books with the return key or by double clicking them. When you've selected the books you want to order click 'Compile Order'.
- To get lists of bestsellers, click on 'Stock Config' and choose 'Title Performance' from the 'Stats Graph' drop down. Select the time period you are interested in with the 'Show Stats for' drop down. Click the tick icon to apply these settings. Once the stats have loaded right click on the graph to choose how many titles to see and whether to filter them by category. Left click on the graph to get a detailed view of these titles.
- To see what customers have been ordering recently, click on the 'Recent Cust Ords' detail button in the central BatchLine tab. You can define what 'recent' means by clicking 'Order Info Config' and changing the 'Recent Customer Orders are less than X days' config.
- To get acknowledgments for orders click 'Awaiting Ack' in the central BatchLine tab. From here you can click 'Get Ack' for a particular order or just click 'Get all Acks' to try to download all Acknowledgments for outstanding orders.
- To clean up old orders Click on 'Old Orders' in the central BatchLine tab and go down the list selecting old orders to delete with the return key. Click 'Cancel or Delete' and then choose either 'Order Arrived Delete' or 'Order Cancelled Delete' for each line that pops up.

What do I have to configure for the Dashboard to work correctly?

You don't *have* to configure anything. However, to get more accurate profit stats you should go to Back Office \rightarrow Maintenance \rightarrow System Config and put in default discounts for book and non-book products as shown below so BatchLine can make good estimates for profits on sales where a reasonable cost price for a product is not available.

You can also go into Back Office \rightarrow Maintenance \rightarrow Categories and mark categories as 'Set Not Returnable' if you don't want products in these categories to be included in suggested returns.

What do the colours on the Dashboard mean?

In terms of sales, revenue or margin the colours mean either up, down or the same when compared to another period. In terms of orders, the colours denote age – green is new, blue is overdue and red is old.

How do I get data out of the Dashboard?

If you are looking at a grid of data on the Dashboard, you can right click and choose 'Make Excel Doc' to export the data to a spreadsheet. If you want as much data as possible click the 'Export Data' button at the bottom of the sales or stock and returns tabs to create spreadsheets of everything.



How do I access more information?
